FROM THE FINANCIAL WIRES...

- Kathy is contacting our bank to see if they will stop charging account service fees because our Kiwanis Club is a community service organization.
- Jeff has added a column to the Financial Report to reflect percentages between budgeted and actual expenditures.
- The Administrative Account balance of \$2,700 includes \$2,000 owed to the E Account. The money was borrowed last year so we could pay International and District Dues. It needs to be paid back.
- The Administrative Account balance is expected to increase by the next report as additional money from dues is posted to the account.



- Jeff has contacted See's Candy to see if they will allow us to sell candy online this year in the likely prospect that we aren't going to be able to sell in front of stores. He is still awaiting their response.
- As of June 30, the Administrative Account had \$2,700 and the E Account (Charitable Giving) had \$20,121. The E Account total includes \$1,109 which belongs to the Mission Viejo High School Key Club and \$510 owed to the Key Clubs at Mission Viejo High (\$300) and Tesoro High (\$210) as their share for See's sales.
- Several E Account budgeted expenditures are on hold due to COVID-19 including the Teacher Classroom Grant Program, Science Heads Mobile Observatory, Key Club Awards and the Mulhaupt Scholarship among several line items.
